- A reminder that UNSW will be moving to three trimesters in 2019. This means that the academic year will start earlier in February and the two mid-year holidays will no longer align with school holidays. There will be 3 x 10 week terms and an optional summer term. Faculties have re-written courses to accommodate the change and there will be no reduction in course content. For further information go to: <https://student.unsw.edu.au/new-calendar.dates>.
- \$15 000 000 available for scholarships.
- Theatre and Performance Studies courses now include internships.
- The selection for Medicine process has been redesigned to **de-select** unsuitable candidates and **enhance selection** on equity. The selection process comprises the UMAT and ATAR, with interviews used to capture 'the human factor'. A high mark in one selection aspect will now not compensate for a low mark in another. Offers will be made on interview mark, ATAR and UMAT, by descending rank of the algorithm used. Only the top 300 students as gauged by ATAR and UMAT will be interviewed.

Organisation for school work

With the start of a new school year, after setting goals for the year, it's time to look at self-organisation to ensure that it is possible to work towards achieving these goals.

How you organise any school study periods will impact on your progress. When you have a study period plan exactly what you want to achieve during that time. Find a quiet place to work (in the library, in an empty classroom) and concentrate on reaching the target you have planned.

Out of school time requires planning too. You want to make time for your extra-curricular activities, perhaps for your part-time job and for socialising. Around this you need to plan how you will fit in the time recommended for your year to meet your study needs. This is:

Up to 1-1/2 hours for Years 7 and 8,
Up to 2 hours for Years 9 and 10,
3 hours for Year 11, and
3-1/2 hours for Year 12.

Find a system which works for you and make it your way of working. It might look like this:

| | <i>Making summary Notes</i> | <i>Set Homework</i> | <i>Revision</i> |
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| Years 7 & 8 | End of each topic in each subject | Nightly – starting with what is due first and a bit on assignments | 10 mins. on one subject topic each night (more closer to exams) |
| Year 9 | End of each topic in each subject | As above and some work nightly on assignments | As above |
| Years 10, 11 and 12 | Make dot points each night on day's work | As above | 10 – 30 ins on one subject topic each night, (may need to do more at weekends before exams and assessments) |
